PK.06.03	Know that it is important to be fair and just because that is how Jesus has taught us to be to one another.
PK.10.02	Recognize that we love our neighbors.
PK.10.04	State that Jesus taught us to care for other people.
PK.12.02	Know that all of God's creation needs care.
PK.12.04	Understand that Jesus showed concern for all people, especially those in need.
K.06.01	State that I am a child of God, both created by and loved by him.
K.06.02	Describe ways we can respond to Jesus' call to love God and love our neighbor (See John 13: 34-35.)
K.06.07	Understand that how we treat others and the things of creation is how we show that we are followers of Jesus.
K.12.05	Recognize that all of God's creation needs care.
K.12.06	Recall that all creation is a gift of God.
1.06.01	Illustrate ways Jesus teaches us to love God and our neighbor, and state the Two Great Commandments of God and their meaning (Jn 13:34-35, Lk 10:25-28).
1.06.02	Show understanding that God created me as good and loving, to be respected and loved by others.
1.10.01	Discuss that all persons are "created in God's image."
1.10.06	Discuss that we treat others the way Jesus would have treated them.
1.12.03	Recognize that God has entrusted to all human beings responsibility for the world and all its creatures.
1.12.06	Know that as Catholics, we promise to take care of all God's creation.
2.06.01	Recognize ourselves as good and deserving of love, created in God's image and likeness (See Genesis 1:27).
2.06.02	Explain that God created us to know, love, and serve him.
2.10.01	Give examples of how we can treat others the way Jesus treated others.
2.10.03	Explain what we mean when we say we are created in God's image.
2.12.01	Define "created in God's image."

2.12.03	State how, as Christians, we promise to care for all of God's creation.
2.12.05	State that we are called to share what we have with others.
3.06.06	Compare and contrast responsible and irresponsible stewardship of God's creation.
3.06.07	State the meaning of justice.
3.06.13	State that <u>Catholic Social Teaching</u> gives us basic ideas or principles that help us know how to live and treat each other and all creation in our personal lives and in the groups to which we belong.
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3.10.02	Recognize that all life is a gift of God which must be respected.
3.12.01	Explain how we show acts of love and kindness to others and to all God's creation.
3.12.04	State that we show our love for God when we help those in need.
3.12.05	Understand that caring for others means considering their needs.
4.06.02	Identify the most important social teaching of the Church: dignity of the human person.
4.06.14	Recognize that the teaching of the Church gives us principles in <u>Catholic Social Teaching</u> that apply to our own lives and how we live with others in our nation and the world
4.10.04	Describe the nature of a relationship with God, ourselves, and others.
4.12.04	Describe examples of how the Church cares for those in need and works to build a better world.
4.12.06	Recognize one's responsibility for stewardship as care for all of God's creation.
5.06.03	Identify moral goodness with justice and stewardship.
5.06.08	Explain why we are called to participate in outreach activities that reach out to the poor, the lonely, and the suffering as Jesus did.
5.10.02	Describe that God created humans with bodies and souls
5.12.03	Identify that the Church teaches that we must work for a more just and fair society and world.
5.12.04	Explain that human life is sacred from its beginning to its natural end.
5.12.07	Define stewardship as responsibility for all God's creation.
6.06.04	Recognize that the state must protect the rights of its citizens through socially just laws.

6.10.01	Identify one's self as being made in the image and likeness of God.
6.12.04	Understand that the way to the Reign of God is a way of justice and peace.
6.12.05	Identify that sin can destroy God's good creation.
7.06.03	State the importance of Christians taking an active part in public life and promoting the common good.
7.06.05	Recognize that, as members of a parish, we have responsibilities that we call stewardship.
7.06.08	State the principles of the social teaching of the Church.
7.06.10	Describe world peace as the work of justice and the effect of charity.
7.06.12	Acknowledge and affirm the dignity of the human person and community.
7.08.03	State that the Church has a special mission to the poor.
7.12.02	State that the Scriptures teach us the importance of working for justice, peace, equality, and stewardship in our lives.
7.12.07	Show understanding that the Christian life requires preferential love for the poor.
8.06.09	Identify the seven themes of Catholic Social Teaching principles.
8.12.01	Realize that the protection of life and the dignity of every person is rooted in Scripture. (Gn 1:26-27, Dt 30:19, 1 Cor 15:22).
8.12.04	Show understanding that disciples practice stewardship as a response acknowledging God as giver of all created and material goods.
8.12.14	Understand that service is action rooted and nurtured in prayer.
8.12.17	Describe stewardship as our responsibility to use our time, talent and treasure as an act of gratitude to God.
8.12.18	Understand that we continue Jesus' mission we participate in the ministries of the Word, worship, build community, and serve others.
